

Szczupak Cup Moran May 25, 2019
Competition Regulations

1. Participants

All people aged 18 and older and qualified by the organizer may take part in the competition. A minor may start only in the care of an adult and with the consent of the organizer. All the participants of the competition take part on their own responsibility.

2. Area and base of the competition

The Special Fishing Ground at Powidz Lake is the area of competition and the Hotel Moran****SPA, 62-430 Powidz, Ostrowo 30, Poland is the base of the competition.

3. Briefing before the competition

The briefing before the competition will take place on May 24, 2019 at 8 p.m. The briefing will cover all necessary information regarding the competition.

4. Duration of the competition

The competition will take place in two rounds on the area of Powidz Lake designated by the organizer at 8 a.m. – 1 p.m. (round one), 2 p.m. – 6 p.m. (round two). A sound signal determined by the organizer starts and ends each round of the competition. Cards will be given until 6:30 p.m.

5. Fishing method and baits

The only allowed method of fishing is spin fishing from an anchored or naturally free-floating boat that is 360 cm long and from fishing canoes and belly boats, using only artificial baits with hooks compliant with the Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development on fishing and conditions of farming and fishing of other organisms living in water.

6. A crew consists of one or two competitors. The competitors are a supervisory judge for each other.

7. The following is forbidden:

- fishing using methods other than spin fishing;
- fishing outside the designated area of the competition;
- sailing up directly to reeds, shores and piers;
- sailing up to other boat participating in the competition closer than 50 m;
- sailing faster than 7 kph, rapid acceleration and other boat manoeuvres;
- fishing from the shore, piers and footbridges;
- attracting fish;
- collecting fish with a tow hook or other harmful tools;

8. Using an echo sounder, an electric engine, a combustion engine and GPS devices is allowed.

9. Competitors possessing boats equipped with a combustion engine are obliged to provide a boat identification number until May 10, 2019 under the pain of not qualifying the boat to the competition.

10. Every competitor is obliged to have a life jacket that he or she protects on his or her own on the boat. The owner of the boat is responsible for equipping the boat in accordance with the bidding

provisions (in boats longer than 4 m: a boat hook, a first aid kit, a fire extinguisher, fenders and a life buoy).

11. During the competition, every competitor must have a start card, which will be given to him or her by the judge before the competition.

12. Fish

The scoring includes only pikes that:

- are at least 50 cm long;
- were caught during and on the premises of the competition;
- were stored under appropriate conditions until passing the fish to the judge;
- in good condition, i.e. the ones that swam away within 3 minutes after measuring and releasing by the judge, counting from delicate putting them into the water.

13. Fish reporting procedure

Every competitor signals catching the fish to the judge by lifting the flag given by the organizer. The judge's boat sails up to the competitor's boat as soon as possible. Then the fish is passed to the judge in a net or a landing net, measured and photographed as well as entered into the record and then delicately released into the water. If the fish is passed to the judge in other way (e.g. with a hand), the competitor bears the consequences of its possible escape from measuring.

14. Scoring and classifications

The competitor gets 1 point for every full centimetre of the length of the fish passed by the judge. There are three classifications: the general one, "Most Effective Hunter," "Best Canoe&Belly Boat." The general classification rates only one, the longest fish of every competitor fishing from the boat or the canoe and belly boat of two rounds. The rank in the general classification depends on the points for the longest fish – the more points, the higher rank. The winner of the general classification is the competitor that caught the longest fish of the competition. In the case of the same number of points for the longest fish, the competitor's higher rank in the general classification depends on the higher sum of points for all the fish caught during the competition.

The rank in the "Most Effective Hunter" classification depends on the points for all the caught fish – the more points, the higher rank. The winner of the "Most Effective Hunter" classification is the competitor that got the highest sum of points for all the caught fish.

The "Best Canoe&Belly Boat" rates only one, the longest fish of every competitor fishing from a canoe and a belly boat of two rounds. The winner of the "Best Canoe&Belly Boat" classification is the competitor that caught the longest fish among the canoes and belly boats. In the case of the same number of points for the longest fish, the higher rank in the classification depends on the higher sum of points for all his or her fish caught during the competition.

15. After the competition, the competitor is obliged to give his or her start card to the designated judge point, however not later than until 6:30 p.m. The competitor that will not give the card within the agreed time will not be classified and will not take part in the draw of the prizes of the competition.

The prizes:

- the competitors that ranked in places from 1st to 3rd in the general classification will be given cups, diplomas and in-kind prizes;
- the winner of the "Most Effective Hunter" classification will be given a diploma and an in-kind prize;
- the winner of the "Best Canoe&Belly Boat" classification will be given a diploma and an in-kind prize;
- the other competitors that gave the start cards will take part in the draw of the prizes.

16. The competitors may be disqualified for;

- fishing beyond the time of or outside the area of the competition;
- fishing using methods other than spin fishing or baits other than artificial ones;
- sailing up to the boats of other competitors closer than 50 meters (the entire crew of the boat may be disqualified);
- docking at the shore, the reed or the pier without the consent of the judge;
- leaving the area of the competition when it is in progress without the consent of the judge;
- not having the start card during the competition;
- not handing over the start card to the judge within the time limit specified by the organiser on the briefing before the competition;
- unsportsmanlike conduct during the competition, including the psychophysical indisposition;
- sailing faster than 7 kph, rapid acceleration and other dangerous manoeuvres with the boat;

17. The competition is secured by the waterway police and the WOPR (Volunteer Water Rescue Services) team.

18. The organiser is not responsible for the tangible losses of the competitors born during the competition.

19. The competitor has the right to submit the objection to the Main Judge only in writing, after paying the deposit of PLN 200 to the organiser's coffers, however not later than 30 minutes after the competition. The deposit will be refunded to the competitor only in the case of taking the protest into the account by the Main Judge.

20. These Regulations are to be interpreted by the Main Judge. The Main Judge settles all the doubts and disputes in the manner of a final decision.

21. The organiser reserves the right to amend these Regulations not later than until May 24, 2019 during the briefing before the competition. The participation in the competition is tantamount to accepting these Regulations and expressing the consent to use the competitor's image by the organiser, the sponsors and the media during the event i.e. on May 24-26, 2019. Applying for the participation in the competition is tantamount to expressing the consent to process the personal data. The personal data will be processed in accordance with the Regulation of May 25, 2018 on the protection of the personal data. (the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679) on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of

personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (“GDPR”). During the registration, the competitor signs an appropriate statement.
